- 5. The main task is to develop the backward and vulnerable sections of the subah society



Forestry program for environmental protection

Afforestation on government land, beside roads and river banks

Subah has been implementing this activity since 2002 by planting saplings produced from Subah's nursery. With the help of Bangladesh NGO Foundation, 4 km afforestation in 2007-08, 4 km afforestation in 2008-09, 3 km in 2009-10, 3 km 4 km in 2011-12, 3 km in 2011-12, 4 km in 2012-13 Forestry programs are being implemented on both sides of the road and on government lands. At present there are 14,000 living fruit, timber and medicinal plants are alive.

In collaboration with the Bureau of Non-Formal Education under the Ministry of Primary and Mass Education, 9,000 men and 9,000 women, a total of 36,000 illiterate people, through 600 learning centers literacy program implemented by Subah SamajikUnnayanSangstha.

Scholarships for poor students

In collaboration with Bangladesh NGO Foundation, Subah SamajikUnnayanSangstha is providing scholarships to poor secondary students in MeherpurSadarUpazila. The project provides assistance to students from families in the community who may drop out of school due to financial reason.

Vulnerable Women Development (VGD) Program

On behalf of the Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh, in collaboration with the Department of Women's Affairs under the Ministry of Women and Children Affairs, the Subah SamajikUnnayanSangstha is implementing the Vulnerabe Women's Development (VGD) program in 4 unions of Mujibnagarupazila of Meherpur district and 9 unions of Gangni upazila.











The VGD program is the largest social safety program of the government, which conducting only to improve the quality of life of women members in rural very poor households. In addition to food assistance (job skills, income-generating training, savings and loans), 2,167 women in MujbinagarUpazila and Gangni Upazila of Maherpur are getting monthly assistance through this program. Subah SamaikUnnayanSangstha is implementing the training program.

Health, nutrition and population control programs

Bangladesh is a populous country. Public and private healthcare facilities are inadequate for the vast majority of the population in this country. Unaware and poor people are deprived of access to the health services they need. As a result, they are now dependent on Jhar-Fuk and illegal methods. These problems are more widespread in rural areas than in urban areas. Subah continues to work to address these fundamental humanitarian issues. Since its inception, the organization has been conducting health, nutrition and population control programs among other activities. All members of the family are being provided free medical services by experts and experienced doctors in the past. Nutrition and population control are being raised. For a long time, Subah has been trying to provide medical services to the poor people at the grassroots level with a service-oriented approach and has been appreciated by all. At present, the activities of Subah Sangstha Health Nutrition and Population Control Project have received a slightly different dimension and are moving forward with more constructive steps. Free medicine and distribution of medicines to the people at the grassroots level is funded by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare of Bangladesh. Under this program, medical camping, health and nutrition and population awareness yard meetings, health seminars, child nutrition food are distributed.

According to the plan, seminars on health, nutrition and population control are organized at the training center of Subah SamajikUnnayanSangstha. It is attended by representatives of government and non-government organizations, dignitaries of the area and a fixed number of grassroots women and men. Regular seminars are held to increase the health nutrition and population awareness of the seminar participants through specialist doctors.

Increasing enrollment of minority and ultra poor children through public motivation

In the minority communities of MeherpurSadarUpazila such as Das (slaves), professional sweepers, fishermen and children from extremely poor families are being deprived of the opportunity to get basic knowledge due to social and economic barriers. Many families are moving away from the light of education due to not going to school. That is why those families remain in the dark. Their quality of life is not improving. At the beginning of the project, a survey was conducted in the area to identify the problems of such children and their families. In this program, parents of minority and extremely poor families, teachers of the nearest school, school management committee, public representatives, religious representatives and other eminent persons of the area have been organized to create awareness environment for the education of deprived children. Posters, leaflets and signboards were put up in the area to raise awareness. To measure the progress of school going by monitoring the children under this program every month.







Educational materials are distributed to the Das community and the poorest children.

Organizing meetings to increase the enrollment of children in schools with the aim of improving the quality of education by targeting the meritorious children and their parents.

Various activities in the implementation of tobacco control laws

Introduction:

Subah SamajikUnnayanSangstha has been an associate member of the anti-tobacco allaince since 2000. It has been conducting various activities in MeherpurSadarUpazila of Meherpur District since 2005 to enforce the Tobacco Control Act. In order to be more active in enforcing the Tobacco Control Act, various activities have been carried out in the past in collaboration with the WBB Trust. The report of these activities is given in detail below.

Tobacco Control Act Monitoring:

Monitoring is an important issue for the implementation of tobacco control laws. An observational survey was first conducted by the Subah SamajikUnnayanSangstha as part of the implementation of the Tobacco Control Act. All these activities identify the ways in which tobacco control laws are being violated. Discussions were held with the concerned on the implementation of the Tobacco Control Act. Subsequently, information related to tobacco control violations was provided to the administration, media and concerned organizations. There has been a positive response from all quarters for the implementation of this law.





Sticker distribution:

The stickers were distributed in the name of Subah in collaboration with the WBB Trust to raise awareness about tobacco control laws. Stickers given by WBB Trust affixed in Meherpur District Council, Office of the Superintendent of Police, Office of Bus Owners Association, Office of Motor Workers Union, Meherpur Passenger Camp, Wapda Passenger Camp, MeherpurSadarUpazila Parishad, Meherpur Press Club, Meherpur Reporters Unity Office, C Hospital, MeherpurSadarUpazila Health and P.P. Office, District Lawyers Association Office, MeherpurSadar Thana, Colleges etc.





Installation of non-smoking sign boards:

As part of awareness about tobacco control laws, 8-inch by 6-inch signboards with inscribed smoke-free
signs are distributed in public places. Signboards are distributed in the areas which are Meherpur
Deputy Commissioner's Office, Superintendent of Police's Office, Judge Court Meherpur, Civil Surgeon's
Office, Upazila Executive Officer's Office, Meherpur General Hospital, MeherpurSadar Thana, Meherpur
Bus Terminal, Shilpakala Academy, Meherpur Municipality. Meherpur Government College.
